

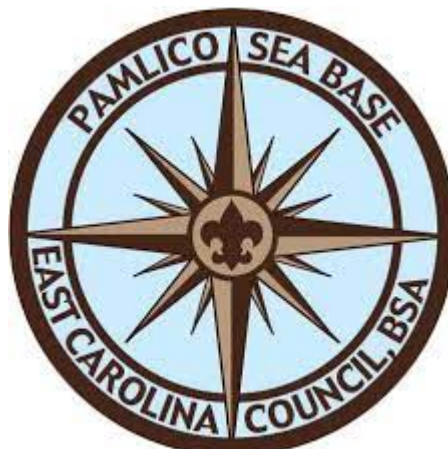

## General Information

1. Introduction to Leadership Skills for Ships/Crews/Troops Training (ILSS/C/T) is an interactive program for Unit Leaders to provide newly elected and appointed Scouts with initial training on their responsibilities, and to equip them with leadership and management abilities to effectively run their ship.
2. The intent of the Sea Scout and Venturing Officer events is to promote Sea Scouting, Venturing and Explorers by providing programming for young adults. All registered Venturer, Sea Scout, Explorers, or older Scout BSA (who are 14 and completed the 8<sup>th</sup> grade) are invited to attend and are encouraged to consider dual registration in a Ship, Crew, or Post.
3. All scouts should adhere to the Scout Oath, Scout Law and Outdoor Code as the rules governing their behavior on camp property.
4. Make sure parents/guardians know the crew/ship number, and the name of the unit leader(s) in attendance.
5. The use of mind-altering substances to include alcoholic beverages by adult or youth members will result in the immediate dismissal from the event site. Parents will be notified to come pick up their scout.
6. Smoking/Vaping is only allowed in the main parking lot at Camp Boddie. Smoking in the bathrooms, on trails, or in campsites is prohibited.
7. Showing of Affection- This is a scouting event, and it is understood that we are dealing with young adults who may become romantically involved with each other. Youth and adults should refrain from signs of affection such as kissing, hugging, holding hands or sitting on top of each other and other inappropriate behavior that may make other uncomfortable. No public displays of affection.
8. **DO NOT DRIVE OR PARK ON THE GRASS!** Vehicles may be parked near the campsite to unload but then must be parked in designated parking areas. Special exceptions for medical reasons can be made with prior approval from event staff.
9. All ships and units will be required to have **2** registered adult leaders in attendance. If there are females in the unit, one leader **must** be registered who is female and YPT trained. All adult leaders will camp with their crews/ships. If a unit is unable to provide qualified adult leadership, they may buddy-up with another unit. This should be coordinated with event staff prior to arriving at the event.
10. Venturing Crews, Explorer Posts, Sea Scout Ships, and STEM scouts are encouraged to attend and participate in all events.
11. All scouts will remain in the Sea Base area throughout the event. If there are compelling reasons or emergencies for leaving, permission must be secured through unit leader and Camp leadership.

12. Scouts should use the buddy system when outside camp areas. The buddy system will require 2 of the same sex. 2 males and 1 female or 1 male and 2 males is allowed when mixing sexes for a group of 3. Groups may be larger than this if YPT rules are followed.
13. Meals will be provided by one of the ships participating. This cost is included in your registration
14. During the events on Saturday, an activity uniform may be worn. Scouts should dress “clean & appropriate” in a unit activity uniform. Shoes should be sneaker type boots, or leather shoes. For safety reasons NO sandals or open-toed shoes will be allowed.
15. Shorts should be school appropriate length. No tank tops of any type for males and females. Shirts should be modest.
16. Please set up the campsite with the Leave No Trace and Tread Lightly principles in mind.
17. Approved lanterns may be used in campsite. Only electric lanterns or flashlights are to be used outside the unit site. Generators will not be permitted on the grounds for units without council executive approval.
18. Swimming in the Pamlico River is strictly **FORBIDDEN** by Scouts and adults. This includes **WADING** in the river.
19. Units are encouraged to bring unit flags and bungees to mark unit sites.
20. A personal or unit watercraft will not be used during the event period without prior approval and coordination.
21. The national flag will be hoisted and lowered at a formal ceremony on Saturday and Sunday. Field uniforms are to be worn and tucked in appropriately.
22. Council Event Insurance covers accidents only and has a deductible. This does NOT cover normal sickness.
23. All persons/guest are required to register at the Camp Office located in Area HQ (Kennedy Center located at Sea Base.)

#### Lodging:

All attendees will utilize their own tents or they may use the hammock garden located at Pamlico sea base. Camping will be in the middle area of sea base.

**Registration:** \$40 per person via Tentaroo for camp usage.

**Medical Forms:** All Camporee participants are required to complete and submit an Annual Health and Medical form. Event staff may ask units to see the Medical Forms and retain the right to remove a unit from camp if forms are not complete. This is the new A&B form on the newly released medical form. (A doctor's signature is not required for this event). The Medical form can be found on the East Carolina Council website under "BSA Forms".

**Flags:** Each Unit is requested to bring their Unit Flag to the event and display them in their campsites. We ask that you also bring your unit flags to the Flag Ceremony on Saturday morning.

**Uniforms:** Scouts should wear their Field Uniform to morning and evening meals and formations Scouting T-shirts Activity Uniform, are to be worn for activities throughout Saturday.
