

2026 Polar Bear Winter Merit Badge Camp at Camp Boddie January 16-18

During this camp weekend, scouts will have a great opportunity to earn merit badges and spend the weekend on the shores of the Pamlico Sound. All activities provide advancement opportunities. Food is provided for this event, so bring your appetite. The fun and fellowship are like nothing you've experienced! We are extremely glad you signed up, "C'mon in the waters fine" for the Polar Plunge!

Merit Badges you can earn: Note: we will not go over cap on the number of participants for each Merit Badge. You must complete the registration in Tentaroo before the close date so we do not have to do this during check in and as it causes issues putting the final MB information in Tentaroo. "Be Prepared"

Note: We will need leaders to help attend each MB class to have 2-deep leadership protection and we may also ask for help with transportation as we are offering classes offsite at my BCCC campus and the Airport.

Completed requirements will be available in Tentaroo within 2 weeks after camp.

Cost: \$65.00 per Scout, \$25.00 for Adults (note: staff will pay \$15 to cover their cost of food to help keep the cost down for scouts so please thank them.)

Saturday Night Activity: the scouts taking Communication MB on Saturday will oversee the campfire ceremony that will honor our Elders.

Adults: Courses offered for paid adults attending:

- Adult CPR Training cost of \$25. You must go register in Tentaroo at the same time when you register for camp. If you just want to attend this training and not camp, you will need to talk with me so I can get you registered.
- > We are also offering Stop the Bleed Certificate training to help ensure our scouts go beyond needing First Aid.
